Whilst as parents we send our students to learn how to read and write and be prepared for adult life, every parent recognises the need for positive friendships. There is such joy in a home when a prep comes home and says Mum, *I made a new friend today*. When asked, *How did that happen?* the response, *he asked me if I wanted to be his friend and I said yes!*, brings a smile to our faces and I am sure we all ponder, if only it was that easy for adults to make new friends!

In Senior Chapel this week, I shared a story from my own experience in Year 7, negotiating the social implications of feeling left out and alone, while on a Youth Group trip. I was unfortunately left out of the main group at a Youth Alive concert, due to no one saving me a seat. I sat two rows behind my youth group, surrounded by 4000 teenagers, in a full hall, yet feeling so very alone. It is interesting how most of us - child, teen or adult - would each have such a story. We have all experienced at some point in our lives the feeling of being on the outer, alone, lonely, even when in a crowded room. Yet in every moment we can take heart. God sees us, He notices us, He knows our pain, our insecurities and our desire for community and it is often not long before our circumstances change.

My encouragement to the students, was the following:

1. We are never alone. Deuteronomy 31:6 *Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the LORD your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you.* God is with us, 24/7, we can trust that!
2. While with God, we are never alone, we do still need that personal interaction. God encourages us and strengthens us through relationships with others - we are designed for community. If God is prompting you to speak to someone new and allow them into your life, don't hesitate, dare to go out on a limb, invite them in.
3. It is amazing how a life changing moment can come in the seemingly small and insignificant moments, or during times of heartbreak or disappointment. Hard moments can be the very thing that help shape us and mold us into who God wants us to be. That moment of loneliness back then is one of the key catalysts for the path God has used to bring me to be a Chaplain today!

A big thank you to our Year 12s, lead by the college Captains, who stepped out of their comfort zones at the end of Chapel to pray for every Year 7. I know I was blessed by their genuine prayers for this significant year in the lives of our Year 7s!

My prayer for every family as we begin 2017 is this, *I pray that out of His glorious riches He may strengthen you with power through His Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the saints, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge-that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.* Ephesians 3:16-19

Administration

Absence Line - 9727 9992

As we begin a new year we would like to remind existing parents, and provide our new parents, with the details of our Absence Line.

If a student is to be away from school, we ask that parents/Homestay parents call the Absence Line on 9727 9992, ideally before 9.00am on the day of the absence. A recorded message will ask you for the following information:

- The name and Home Group of the absent student(s)
- Your name (the name of the parent or guardian)
- The (brief) reason for the absence
- The dates of the absence period (e.g., 1 day or 3 days; if you are uncertain, then please leave a message to say e.g., *2 days for now*, and call again on the 3rd day to update the information).

This system should also be used if the student will be late to arrive at school. Please note that students will still be required to sign in/out at the Student Reception.

The messages you leave will be recorded and archived, and they will form part of our official records.


If a student is absent, but we have not received a phone call from you, we may attempt to contact you. Obviously, this is a time-consuming task for our staff, so we would greatly appreciate your phone call. (Messages can be left in advance and at any time of day or night.)

We will also take this opportunity to remind you that medical certificates are required for all VCE students if they miss any form of assessment and for VCE students and international students where they have had more than three days of absence in a term.





Music

Mr Tim Ong will be part of our Year 2 Strings Program and will teach Violin and Viola. Mr Tristan Webb is our new teacher of Brass. He will also be part of our Year 7 Instrumental Program and will assist Mr Chan with the Senior Concert Band. We hope to have a new Contemporary Guitar teacher soon.

Our private music lessons have started. All students should have received a timetable for their Term 1 lessons. Please remember that it is the student's responsibility to know their music lesson time and arrive at their lesson in a timely manner. We are starting the year off with EISM competition sport for Years 10 to 12 (Senior students) with our first round commencing yesterday. Our Senior students will be the only group participating in team competition during Term 1.

Swimming

Years 7 to 9 students will be trialling for swimming and athletics during Term 1. Our In-House Swimming Carnival will take place on Thursday 16 February at Croydon Outdoor Memorial Pool. Parents are welcome to attend to support their children.

In preparation for swimming, Year 7s attended trials on Monday 6 February and selected students will also attend on Monday 13 February at Lilydale Outdoor Swimming Pool during Periods 5 and 6. Sport for Year 7 students always takes place on Mondays during Periods 5 and 6.

Today, Thursday 9 February, Years 8/9 will also have the opportunity for trials at Lilydale Outdoor Pool.

Students who perform well during the In-House Swimming Carnival will represent Oxley in the EISM Division 2 Carnival against other schools on Tuesday 14 March at Aquanation Swimming Pool in Ringwood.



A reminder that all students should continue to enter and depart from the School via the Yellow Square, as per the map below.


Parents and others dropping-off or picking-up students are requested to continue parking in the car parks around the LMC Church building. Please be mindful that parents of Junior School students are given priority to park in Car Parks A-C.

As our students are not always mindful of the many cars using our roads, wherever possible, but especially required for students in Prep to Year 4, parents and other responsible adults are encouraged to walk their children to the Yellow Square before school, and to walk their children from the Yellow Square after school.

All road users are requested to maintain speeds at no faster than walking pace at drop-off and pick-up times, and to only park in lined parking areas. Please do not park on the sides of the main road, which hinders the vision of drivers turning in to and out of parking bays.

We appreciate that at peak times cars may need to queue for up to 10 (or so) minutes, especially to exit the property. We are not unlike many other schools in relation to student drop-offs and pick-ups, where courtesy and patience is necessary, so as to maintain safety for our students. We recommend that, whenever possible, you drop your children off 5-10 minutes earlier in the morning, or pick your children up 5-10 minutes later in the afternoon, so as to reduce the number of vehicles exiting the property at peak times.
