

Colossians 3:12-14 *Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity.*

Happy new year! I love a new year, a new start. They bring with them new opportunities, new friends, new teachers and also a chance to have a fresh start. Maybe we made mistakes last year? I wonder what would happen if you made the decision now that this year will be different? What choices could you make, even right now, to see that this year is the best it can be?

they are. Jesus wasn't like this, He always wanted to talk about His Father, God, rather than Himself. He washed feet!

To this we add some gentleness (or quiet strength) and some patience (or discipline). Living this new life isn't always easy, but anything that is worth anything rarely is. Leadership is hard but very rewarding. Learning new things is hard, but how proud are you when you master them. Running 50 metres the first time, we get all puffed out but the more we do it and the more disciplined we are, the easier it becomes. Living the new life, the life Jesus has intended for us, gets easier the more we allow Him to influence us and change us and mold us.

Then it is Christ we rely on who makes us strong. Stronger than we think we are, able to handle more than we think we can. Jesus our solid rock, our firm foundation, He never leaves us and nothing can separate us from His love! It is because of His love and His grace that we learn to love, truly love, because He loved us first.

Lastly, because He forgives us, over and over and over and over again. We can learn how to forgive others. This is an amazing life Jesus offers us! This new life!

Administration

Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF) – Information for Parents

The Victorian Government has established the CSEF to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. These costs are included in the levies that are billed to your school account. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card, (e.g. Centrelink Health Care Card, Veterans Affairs Gold Card, or Pensioner Concession Card), or you are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF.

The annual CSEF amount per student will be:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

For more information about CSEF, and to download the CSEF application form, visit www.education.vic.gov.au/csef. Note: Application forms are also available at the Reception Desk at the College's Administration Office. Application forms should be lodged as soon as possible, with payments expected from March 2019.

Please note that the College is required to sight and copy any relevant concession cards that you may hold to support eligibility for the CSEF. Please bring your concession card with you when you deliver your application to the College Administration Office.

Upon approval by the Victorian Government, the allowance will be paid to the College, which will then be applied to your school account.




