Year 3

We have been enjoying writing procedural texts. We have learned that instructions need to be ordered with specific and clear vocabulary, starting with a command! 
Year 4

Students have been involved in some exciting Science experiments designed to explore the concept of Forces. We have looked at physical force, push and pull and non-contact forces, gravity and magnetism. This week, we will test the impact of friction on different materials. Using the new knowledge we have gained, we will then design a game that demonstrates these understandings. We will design, build, test, modify and adapt our game, before it is played by our Prep buddies.

Year 5

It has been exciting to discover that the word 'transform' can be applied to Maths and English. In reading, we have been learning about transforming our thinking. We read an amazing book, What It Means to Be Present. Before reading, many of us thought present meant either a gift or the time we are currently in. After reading the book,

we discovered that being present can also mean the way we interact with other people. In Maths, we investigated transformations. We used translations, rotations and reflections to transform or change the appearance of an object. We applied this learning to create our initials and a picture to represent ourselves and our interests.

We are looking at the term *variable* in Science, and how they are important for conducting a fair test. Using this knowledge, we are planning an investigation, conducting it accurately and reporting our findings. We are thinking carefully about each visual element and how it can enhance our reader's experience. We can't wait for you to read each step and see if you can follow them easily.

With Ned's help, some fun illusions, yo-yo tricks and a fun story line, students learned about the power of yet – "I can't do it ... yet!" 
NED stands for:

2021



Your understanding and compliance with this request is essential.


Teardrop Carpark
