Food For The Soul

Ask anyone who knows me well, what my favourite food is. They are certain to reply, "food!". When asked, do you have any dietary requirements for school camp, my answer is "yes... seconds!" I enjoy my food. Food brings flavour, it is central to conversation, family time, celebrations, culture.

In the same way, the Scriptures, God's words of life to us, are food for the soul and central to our Christian beliefs, culture and teachings. This food brings nourishment to the spirit and transforms the mind.

The Bible is described as milk, water, honey, meat, bread. It is food for the soul. If the Bible is supposed to be such good food, we need to consume more of it, do we not? If it supposedly holds the answers to life's challenges, we need to seek its advice. If within its pages it holds the secrets of life lived to the full and life everlasting, well, we should explore it! No?

There are three important claims the Bible makes about itself. That the Scriptures are inspired by God; that the Bible is true; and that God's Word is relevant and useful in the world today.

The message of the Bible is clear, engaging and relevant. As humans we are always keen to discover significance and meaning and the Bible alone explains the original plan of God, how it was corrupted and how God has provided for man's restoration through His Son Jesus.

God's reputation is twenty-four-carat gold,
with a lifetime guarantee.
The decisions of God are accurate
down to the nth degree.

In Hebrews 4:12 we learn that the Bible is not a dead piece of writing, but rather it's alive, sharper than any double-edged sword and can be used to judge the attitudes of the heart.

Psalm 119:105 says, "Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path"

1 Thessalonians 2:13 says that the Bible is not human words, but actually the Word of God Himself.

This year Pastor Hal Oxley, the founding Pastor of Life Ministry Church and who Oxley Christian College is named after, turns 102. One of his catch cries over fifty plus years of ministry is "what does the Bible say?" Whenever anyone would ask him a deep question, his reply, more often than not would be, "what does the Bible say?" Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF) – Information for Parents

The Victorian Government has established the CSEF to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. These costs are included in the levies that are billed to your school account. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card, (e.g. Centrelink Health Care Card, Veterans Affairs Gold Card, or Pensioner Concession Card), or you are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF.

The annual CSEF amount per student will be:

\$125 for primary school students

\$225 for secondary school students

For more information about CSEF, and to download the CSEF application form, visit www.education.vic.gov.au/csef. Note: Application forms are also available at the Reception Desk at the College's Administration Office. Application forms should be lodged as soon as possible, with payments expected from March 2018.

Please note that the College is required to sight and copy any relevant concession cards that you may hold to support eligibility for the CSEF. Please bring your concession card with you when you deliver your application to the College Administration Office.

Upon approval by the Victorian Government, the allowance will be paid to the College, which will then be applied to your school account.
