# From the Principal

Dear Friends,

We are so very pleased to welcome students back for learning onsite, and we look forward to having all students return as soon as possible. While our highest concern at present is student welfare, there is no doubt that a quick return to classroom routine will greatly assist the wellbeing of most students. I congratulate families on their resilience and determination over the past few months of remote teaching and learning. Thank you also for the many supportive comments to our staff as they have worked under less than ideal conditions.

Having just welcomed them back, we now extend to our Year 12 graduating class good wishes for the last two weeks of their school year and for the examinations next month. A detailed account of final events for this group will be provided soon, and our prayers for a successful year, in spite of the difficulties, will accompany them. Our task over many years has been the nurture and formation of a virtuous character and the development of skills in learning how to learn. We want the best for students so that they flourish in any future setting and will eventually be able to look back on a life well lived. In addition, at the time of enrolment, we trust parents were choosing the College as a Christian community and culture in which to immerse their child. Indeed, our staff will have been delighted to have contributed to such a culture and expectation of Christian mission covering their teaching and learning. Our hope is that graduates will be restless in the search for truth especially in the inner journey of spirit, so that along with Augustine, students will come to say; You have made me for Yourself, O Lord, and my heart is restless until it finds rest in You.

The excitement of our Junior School students in seeing the progress of new buildings is palpable. Progress is on schedule and over the next two weeks the second half of this project will take on a more definitive shape. Sharing roads with builders can be tricky, but for the most part, family drop off and collection at the carparks is unimpeded. We appreciate greatly your patience as drivers, and hopefully, the drop off and pick up routines will settle into a better pattern in coming days.

We are hopeful that the government will begin to relax restrictions from next week. This may not affect

schools as much as we might like. If nothing else, the pandemic has provided many opportunities to reflect on the relationships between health and economics, relationships of trust and fear, and relationships between government and the governed. The fragility of both life and our assumed human rights have been discussed endlessly. In a lot of respects a Christian education is one that cultivates the human spirit by presenting a complete vision of humanity as we live and ought to live in all domains - the individual, social and religious. It teaches how to fulfil our obligations to self, to others and to God and His creation. Its understanding of humanity is of course, normative and prescriptive in that we must recognise and accept as fundamental the human stature that it seeks. It is not something that can be forced on anyone, but rather, depends on an awakening of spirit, a delightful and joyful realisation that the treasure to be found is unquestionably worth more than anything else. As Matthew 13:44 puts it, the Kingdom of Heaven is like a treasure hidden in a field. A man found it, hid it again, then in great joy went and sold everything he owned and bought that field.

# Chaplain's Corner

## **Operation Christmas Child**

Each year, we have the opportunity and the privilege to partner with Samaritan's Purse and Operation Christmas Child, to provide a gift to a child who is underprivileged, living in a developing country and in desperate need of love and hope and the good news of Jesus Christ. Oxley has been putting together Christmas Shoeboxes for over 19 years and was one of the very first schools to take part when the program was first established in Australia.

In all the years we have been involved, this year, your help is needed more than ever. We want boys and girls around the world to know that God loves them and has not forgotten them during this time of fear and uncertainty. Will you help fill a shoebox this year?

Normally, for your convenience, a shoebox has been sent home with all Junior School students, Year 7 students and to students from higher year levels who have requested a box. This year we will only send shoeboxes home with those who specifically request one. Students can request a box via their Home Group teacher. Alternatively, you may have an old shoebox that you can re-purpose and even decorate?

Information explaining how to pack your box, what items to put in your box and what should be avoided can be viewed at: <a href="https://oxley.cc/shoebox">https://oxley.cc/shoebox</a> There is also a request for a voluntary \$10 donation to help fund the substantial costs involved in seeing over 370,000 gift-filled shoeboxes hand delivered to seven nations around the world.

Alternatively this year, if shopping for and preparing a box is difficult for you, a new option exists where you can purchase a pre-prepared box for \$30. In January 2020, a team of 19 Year 12 students and four staff travelled to Cambodia, where they had the

opportunity to distribute some of these shoeboxes and see firsthand the difference they can make in the life of a child. Every child receiving a shoebox will also receive a Greatest Journey booklet, translated into their language. This helps them to understand the love of Christ, as shown through those who have prepared and shared a box.

Don't forget that shoeboxes are only the beginning, an entry point into a community.



I have seen, firsthand, how a shoebox distribution in a community soon turns into water filtration projects, safe migration training, parenting classes, establishment of maternal health centres and the rebuilding and resourcing of schools. Together we are making a quantifiable difference!

Completed shoeboxes should be returned to the designated trolley, in front of the Administration Building by Friday 30 October 2020.

It is with sadness that we did inform Year 11 students this past week of the cancellation of the 2021 Cambodia Trip, where they would have had the opportunity to hand out these shoeboxes in person. Unfortunately, with the Covid-19 situation as it stands, Samaritan's Purse is unable to run the trip, with international travel still unavailable. We look forward to investigating alternative opportunities for these students as restrictions begin to ease.

Thank you for partnering with us to help transform lives! Let's get shoebox packing!!

#### Year 1






### Year 5


