Hello everyone, and thank you for the warm welcome.



Car Parking

Kiss & Go Zone

A Kiss & Go Zone in the Teardrop car park operates for the drop-off of Year 10-12 students each morning between 8.15am and 8.45am. We ask that you respectfully follow the guidelines below:

- 1. Please obey the speed limit of 20kph (maximum).
- 2. Standing in the Zone is limited to one (1) minute (maximum). Hence, no parking in the Zone.
- 3. Vehicles may only utilise the seven (7) vehicle 'standing' spaces, designated by yellow cones.
- 4. Hence, vehicles should not use other car parking spaces set aside for handicapped drivers, deliveries, ambulance services, First Aid, or visitors to the Administration building.
- 5. Vehicles must remain in the sequence in which they entered the Zone.
- 6. Use the most available space, closest to Gate 2.
- 7. No double parking in the Teardrop (whether in front of the BPAC or in the Kiss & Go Zone).
- 8. No U Turns or 3-point turns permitted.
- 9. Students must only disembark from vehicles from the kerbside (left side of vehicle).
- 10. Students should be alert and ready to disembark vehicles with care. Students should not hurry, but should not dawdle either. (Any necessary parent-student conversations should happen before arriving at the Zone.)

- 11.Students should move away from the vehicle they have disembarked from and move to the walkway area before the vehicle moves to exit.
- 12. Vehicles in the Zone should only move when the vehicle in front has moved on.
- 13. Drivers must exit via Gate 2 Left turn only onto Old Melbourne Road (to alleviate traffic congestion at Gate 1).
- 14. Drivers and students must respect the Kiss & Go rules and follow staff directions at all times, without complaint.
- 15. Courtesy and patience are required to be shown at all times by drivers and passengers.
